Norfolk Island Experience

With Trade Travel.



Shakshuka



Shakshuka originated in North Africa as a hearty breakfast dish, but soon spread around the Mediterranean. It's a particularly popular breakfast dish in Israel. In Egypt, sometime fried chunks of lamb or beef are added.

Ingredients

- 1tblsp extra virgin olive oil
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 1 red capsicum, chopped
- 2tsp paprika
- 2tsp cumin
- 1tsp coriander
- ¼ tsp dried chilli flakes or
- 3 cloves garlic
- 1 400g can peeled tomatoes
- 4 eggs
- ½ cup parsley, chopped
- ½ cup coriander leaves, shopped
- · Sea salt flakes to taste

Utensils

Cutting board; chef's knife; medium-size frypan; wooden stirring spoon; fine grater; large spoon; spatula.

Time

About 30 minutes for the sauce, 5-7 minutes for the eggs.

Preparation

- Add onion and capsicum to the pan with the oil and cook until onions are soft.
- Stir in condiments and grate garlic into mixture, cook for 5 minutes and add tomatoes.
- 3. Break up tomatoes in pan with the stirring spoon. Turn down heat to low and simmer for about 30 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- 4. Using the back of a large serving spoon, make four, evenly spaced indents in the mixture and crack an egg carefully into each indent.
- Cover and cook for 5-7 minutes for soft yolks or longer until your liking.
- Serve with parsley and coriander scattered on top and pita bread on the side.
